**3rd November, Forest School** – We're thrilled to offer our school leavers the opportunity to take part in Forest School sessions with Linda Keynes and Toby Radenhurst from St Wilfrid's School, supported by our preschool team. Children will be divided into two groups and attend on alternate weeks to enjoy exciting outdoor adventures—learning about nature, teamwork, and exploring through play.

**4**<sup>th -</sup> **12**<sup>th</sup> **November, Christmas Photoshoot & Fundraiser** – It's that magical time of year again! **5**<sup>th</sup> **November, Bonfire Night** – To celebrate Bonfire Night, the children will: create colourful firework art using paint and glitter, listen to stories about fireworks, talk about the sounds, colours, and safety of bonfire celebrations.

**10**<sup>th</sup> – **14**<sup>th</sup> **November, World Nursery Rhyme Week** - This special week is all about celebrating the magic of nursery rhymes and how they help children learn and grow. Through singing, rhymes, movement, and lots of fun, we'll be helping our children build their vocabulary, develop early literacy and phonics awareness, explore counting and numeracy, and strengthen important social and physical skills.

11<sup>th</sup> November, Remembrance Day - We'll be introducing the children to the theme of Remembrance through simple discussions about kindness, peace, and helping others. A special visitor from the armed forces will come to talk with the children, helping them understand the importance of remembering and caring for others.

**13<sup>th</sup> November, World Kindness Day** - To celebrate World Kindness Day, we'll be focusing on showing kindness in our classroom. Together, we'll create a beautiful "Kindness Tree" — each time a child performs a kind act, they will add a leaf to the tree with their name and what they did. This helps children see how small acts of kindness can make a big difference.

17<sup>th</sup> – 21<sup>st</sup> November, "People Who Help Us Week" - We're very excited to welcome a variety of visitors who will come and talk to the children about how they help our community and look after others. Visitors will include a train driver, a postman, a paramedic, and a police officer.
